#### Who Are You?

But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him. (1 Corinthians 6:17)

"Who are you?" Have you been asked that question before? I have been asked this question several times this week when helping out in my neighborhood. It sounds like a simple question requiring for a simple straightforward answer. People usually answer to that question by giving their: "my name is John." However, your name is not really who you are. It is what you are called. Others mention their nationality, professional rank, or denomination.

Who are you? If your name was changed, would you still be you? Of course! What about if your nationality, profession, or denomination changed? Would you still be you? Yes ,of course! That simply means you are more than your name or other things you use to identify yourself. You are more than your physical features or possessions.

Many define themselves by what they do: "I'm a nurse" or "I'm a pastor." Others identify themselves by religious affiliation: "I'm a Catholic" or "I'm a Charismatic." However, none of these really answers well to the question: "Who are you?"

The real you is a spirit created in the image of God. You are a spirit being. The scripture readings suggest we are. We are not just a social or physical being. We were a spirit before we put on flesh. When all the external identities are stripped off, we find our real identity.

If your spirit is in union with Christ, we can boldly proclaim, "I am a child of God." You are who you are because of to whom you belong. Are you for Christ? If you are, then you have your answer. You are a child of the Most High God. Say it loudly: "I'm a Child of God." In this time and age, we need to know, and boldly confess, that we are heirs of the Most High God.

**Devotional:** Bob Burke read from Romans 12.

Good News Items: Wonderful picnic, VBS was well attended with approximately 75 children and adults, choir in the Damascus Parade, bells played several times during worship in July and August, "caroling" at the nursing homes, chicken and Ham dinner.

**Action Items:** Tammy Monarch made a motion to accept the June 20, 2017 minutes as written and published, Becky Lewis seconded, vote taken and approved as written.

#### **Committee Reports**

**Trustees - Andi Brickman:** Amount the Trustees can spend without approval from Administrative Council and Finance will be \$2,500. Tammy Monarch made a motion, Mike Sherwood seconded, vote taken and approved.

Septic at the Staley House: Location has been determined; it will be dug out and capped. Jim Kemp to check to see if the clean-out goes into the tank, after it is located, it will be pumped. Trustees will call to have it pumped and add a manhole.

Discussion on sanitizer for the kitchen: We do not have the space without taking out the back sinks. It would also require the addition of a garbage disposal and spray hose. Pastor Karen will take this information to the Lions Club working group and get prices, then take the prices to Trustees. The Lions Club wants to use the Education Building and kitchen for its fundraising Pancake Breakfast on October 21. Approved; the club will be asked to make a donation instead of paying a rental fee.

**Christian Education – Tammy Monarch:** Sunday School opened with 18 people in attendance. The topic for fall is Heaven. Questions: Is there a need

for Confirmation Class? Is there a need for Youth Group?
