#### From Pastor Karen...

**Brothers and Sisters in Christ:** 

For the past year, I have had the pleasure of getting to know one of the youngest children in our congregation, Abby Crawford. A year ago, I would arrive at work, grab Abby out of the pack -and-play, place her in my lap, and begin our naptime ritual of my singing and rocking her (and sometimes me) to sleep. It wasn't long before Abby began to trust me and greet me with arms raised so that we could spend "lap time' together.

There is a documentary about an effective education project for troubled teenagers called "Omega Project." It highlights a program that provides tutors and mentors for young men and women who have grown up with little or no parental guidance. In the film, an elderly teacher comments that, several times a week, he tries to give each of the teenagers "lap time." During "lap time," the gentleman listens to the teens talk about their lives — their struggles and their victories — and after careful consideration, he provides wise counsel for overcoming the obstacles that are ever-present in their lives.

Of course, the teacher was using a figure of speech when he spoke of "lap time." A special moment of undivided attention is what this man offers. But, as a mother, I know the benefits of another kind of "lap time." Those treasured moments of snuggling or reading provide a time to reconnect after a hectic day, as well as an unique opportunity for communication between souls.

The time the teacher spends in one-on-one conversation with teenagers, or the time we spend listening to each other, is no less valuable than the time I have spent with Abby. Whether with adults or children, "lap time" is a time to get at the heart of the matter, to offer love in the midst of heartache and compassion to a weary soul. What a different world this would be if we intentionally gave one another "lap time" — a special moment of undivided attention, a time for soul sharing. Jesus modeled this type of caring over and over again. The woman beside the well, the fishermen, the tax collectors, the woman who touched the hem of his garment were all blessed by a little "lap time" with Jesus.

We could all benefit from a little bit of "lap time" to comfort and to be comforted, to love and to be loved, to trust and to be trusted. As fall approaches and school days begin, don't forget to find time in the midst of all of the busy-ness to be a blessing to others as you share your eyes, your ears, and your heart with others.

#### **Don't Throw That Away!**

Remember to save items for our area schools, libraries, and nursing homes. All of our local facilities appreciate your help!

General Mills Box Tops for Education: These box tops can be found on all General Mills products (including cereal, granola bars, rice mixes, pasta mixes, etc.), Bisquick, Betty Crocker cake mixes and frosting, Old El Paso products, Kleenex brand tissues, Zip-lock and Hefty plastic bags and paper plates, Avery office supplies, Yoplait yogurt, and many other products, so check out your packaging carefully before throwing it away. Each one is worth 10 cents, so the money can add up quickly!

**Tyson's A+ for Education:** These labels can be found on all Tyson chicken products – both fresh and frozen. Each one is worth 24 cents for an area school.

**Printer Ink Cartridges:** Don't throw these away! Schools can recycle them for cash.

**Small Plastic Lids:** Save the ones that you take off of soda and water bottles as well as gallon milk jugs and orange juice containers. Art teachers use these to mix small amounts of paint and to make collages.

**Recent magazines:** When you are done reading these, do not recycle them. Instead, give them to an area nursing home. They like to have these available for their residents to read and enjoy. They also enjoy receiving books, cards, puzzles, and games.

Books (both hardback and paperback): Donate these to the Damascus Public Library, and they will resell them at a low cost to raise funds to buy new books.

Used comforters, blankets, sheets, towels, and pillows: These items will be donated to area animal shelters and rescue centers to provide bedding for the animals.

**Eyeglasses:** Give these to the Damascus Lions Club, and they will repurpose them for needy members of our community.

You can save all of these items and send them to area services yourself, or you can bring them to church and give them to Tammy. She will be sure that they get to one of our many area schools and/or local nursing homes.

In addition, remember to bring your aluminum foil, cans, and pie plates as well as other used metals to our three big yellow bins at the hall. Andi Brickman takes all of this to the recycling center in Frederick several times a year to earn money for our church.

Thanks to all of you who already collect these things to help support our area schools, nursing homes, libraries, and, of course, ourselves!


