Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." (Isaiah 40:3-5)

Michael's had Christmas trees in the store way before October 31! Halloween and Thanksgiving and Christmas seem to have been blended together into one extremely long Christmas shopping season! Eve. In this season, Christians celebrate the coming of the Christ Child and anticipate the return of Christ in his Second Advent. It is not simply about celebrating a historical event that occurred more than 2,000 years ago, but also about waiting for the promised return of Christ.

Do you remember, as a child, the buildup to Christmas Day? The joyful anticipation of what would be under your tree? The anticipation building day by day, from Thanksgiving to Christmas? I can still search deep in my memory and remember the happiness of that anticipation again. That is the joy of Advent. Not in anticipating the presents under the tree, but in anticipating the one who came to give us the present of salvation. The anticipation of the one born in a lowly manger who would die on the cross because he loves you and me so much that he gave us the ultimate gift.

The Bible has many stories about waiting, anticipation, getting ready. We just completed the Hebrew Bible lessons on Moses, the Exodus, and the trip to the Promised Land in this fall's lectionary. The Hebrew people waited for someone to save them from Pharaoh. They waited to enter the Promise Land. And the Hebrews waited a very long time for the birth of the Messiah. The wise men followed the star a great distance in anticipation of worshipping the Christ Child. Our faith stories remind us that while it is hard to wait and travel long difficult roads, the times of waiting and anticipation teach us to slow down and pay attention to how God moves in and through us and others. As we travel once again this year toward Bethlehem and prepare to greet the newborn babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in the manger, let us travel it in breathless anticipation. This is what the season of Advent is all about: preparing, waiting, anticipating, and looking forward to the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ Emmanuel.

Too often, we allow retailers to rush us through this time of wonder, this time of preparation. Too often, we think it is about the perfect gift, forgetting that we have already been given the perfect gift. Therefore, we fill our days to the brim and allow others to rush us from Point A to Point B and we cheat ourselves out of Advent.

I invite you to make this Advent a time of joyful, breathless anticipation. Don't let the retailers and advertisers con you into believing it is about the latest fads, the newest and biggest gadgets. Don't let them cheat you out of Advent. This isn't the Christmas season: That is the 12 days between Christmas and Epiphany. This is Advent, the season of anticipation, the season of preparation for the coming of the King. Sing the wonderful Advent hymns in breathless anticipation. When you hear the words, "O Come, O Come Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel..." remember your childlike eagerness for the coming of Christmas, the celebration of Jesus' birth. Enjoy it. Enjoy it for yourself. Enjoy it with your family. I found an Advent Calendar on the UMC Discipleship Ministries website and have shared it with you in this newsletter. I pray that it helps you "... prepare the way of the Lord" this Advent season. Please enjoy it and may it bless you from the first Sunday of Advent through Christmas Dav. May God bless you and your family this Advent season.

In the three years that I have been Ad Board Chair, the amount of work put out by the committees of this church was simply phenomenal. In all aspects (to the astonishment of the District), we were the standard by which goals and accomplishments were measured. We provided food for needy and hungry children, along with school supplies. We participated in St. Martin's Soup Kitchen, providing food for the hungry. We did Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets for families in need, developed and hosted programs for special needs individuals, established a music program that enhanced our church services and became part of our outreach to the community, as well as providing three cantatas each year. The education program expanded from just VBS (which was always a success) to a large and active Sunday School as the number of children attending grew. The joy is that the parents attend and help as well. We have reached out into the community and our attendance is growing. This is not the time to rest on our laurels though. 
