During the Christmas season, we also spend more time with God, thinking about God's perfect gift, singing about the love that comes down at Christmas, because, well because God loves us and we love God. But in January, do we tuck God away, bringing out Jehovah only on Sunday mornings? God is your family too and his love comes down for us in January, in February — you get my drift. God loves you so much that He left the divinity of heaven, was incarnated, and put on human form, to be with you! So spend time with your Heavenly Father, ready your Bible. Talk with Him. Spend time in conversation, in prayer.

What else makes Christmas time special for you? Those special things you love at the holidays do not need to end after Christmas.

Maybe people seem to be nicer to each other during the season. Well, even if others stop being nice after Christmas, do you have to stop? We read in John 3:16: "God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." God's love is life-giving and doesn't end on December 25 or even January 6. So why too often do we no longer see examples — or are examples of Jesus' love — after then? Keeping the Christmas Spirit is to continue to mirror God's love to a world that is missing that love, daily. St. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 12:4-8, "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." So, be patient, be kind. We don't need three Christmas ghosts to remind us that we are to do these things, live this way, feel this love daily and not only during the "Christmas season." It is hard work keeping this Christmas Spirit alive in us just until Epiphany, but as we enter into the time after Epiphany, as we read the Gospel stories of Jesus, he is teaching us this is what we must do — for each other, for our families, and for the stranger we do not know. It makes no difference that as you were entering the building, the person in front of you closed the door in your face, the Christmas Spirit wants you to hold the elevator for the person hurrying down the hall to get it. So what if it is your turn to zipper into traffic and yet someone else cuts you off? The Christmas Spirit says let it go, maybe even say a prayer for that person.

Bring your Christmas Spirit with you into 2016. I can guarantee that the end of 2015 will not bring about the end to war, the end to gun violence, the end to bigotry and hatred — and I pray it doesn't bring the end to love. Love doesn't have to end at Christmas, you can carry it into the New Year to share all 366 days of 2016 and then into 2017 — but let's just take it one year at a time. Remember, the Christmas Spirit can be described in one four-letter word, L - O - V - E, and ...

Love came down at Christmas, Love all lovely, Love Divine, Love was born at Christmas, Star and Angels gave the sign.

Don't Throw That Away!

January is a month that many of us make resolutions to clean out the old and make room for the new. As you are doing this, think about what items can be recycled, reused, and/or reconditioned and what items are truly trash. Here is a list of items that should be saved for area schools, animal shelters, nursing homes, and other community organizations. Just bring these items to the vestibule at church, and Tammy Monarch will see that they get delivered to their new homes.

General Mills Box Tops for Education: These box tops can be found on all General Mills products (including cereal, granola bars, rice mixes, pasta mixes, etc.), Bisquick, Betty Crocker cake mixes and frosting, Old El Paso products, Kleenex brand tissues, Zip-lock and Hefty plastic bags and paper plates, Avery office supplies, Yoplait yogurt, and many other products, so check your packaging carefully before throwing it away. Each one is worth 10 cents, so the money can add up quickly!

Campbell's Labels for Education: These labels are found on all Campbell's beans, gravies, and soups (both cans and individual servings) as well as on V-8 products, Vlasic pickles, Swanson frozen products, Prego spaghetti sauce, and all Pepperidge Farm products. Be sure to cut the dashed coupon part off of each product label.

Tyson's A+ for Education: These labels can be found on all Tyson chicken products – both fresh and frozen. Each one is worth 24 cents for an area school.

Caps from All Coca-Cola Products: Schools collect these for money too.

Printer Ink Cartridges: Don't throw these away! Schools can recycle them for cash.

Small Plastic Lids: Save the ones that you take off of soda and water bottles as well as gal-

lon milk jugs and orange juice containers. Art teachers use these to mix small amounts of paint and to make collages.

Magazines and Paperbacks: When you are done reading these, do not recycle them. Instead, give them to an area nursing home. They like to have these available for their residents to read and enjoy.

Eyeglasses: The Damascus Lions Club reconditions these for needy folks in our community.

Sheets, Blankets, Towels, Pillows: These are used by local animal shelters for bedding.

Small Trinkets, Prizes, Gifts: We can use these types of things for bingo prizes.

Extra 2016 Calendars: Bring these to the vestibule for others to take and use at their homes.

New or Gently Used Stuffed Bears: We can use these for our new Prayer Bear Ministry.

In addition, remember to bring your **aluminum foil, cans, and pie plates** as well as **other used metals** to our three big yellow bins at the hall. Andi Brickman takes all of this to the recycling center in Frederick several times a year to earn money for our church.

Thanks to all of you who already collect these things to help support our area schools, nursing homes, animal shelters, and, of course, ourselves!
