

## **Communications Committee News**

To all Committee Chairs, their members, and event coordinators:

In an effort to keep our "best foot forward" with the community and those who see our church signs, as a matter of policy, we strive to ensure that the sign information is current. If someone drives by our signs and sees an event that was three days prior, for example, this indicates to the public that we are not a "current" church, but a "lazy" church that doesn't make the simplest effort to keep public signage information up to date.

For anyone who is hosting an event at the church that occurs on a Friday after office hours, a Saturday, or on a Sunday: church policy is that whoever is hosting the event is responsible for changing the sign to the next event. Karen Allman, our office manager, will ensure that the next event's information, sign letters, and sign keys are placed in a box in the Education Building ready to be posted. For example, if an event is held on Saturday, and the event is on the sign, whoever is hosting the event is responsible for changing the sign to the next event after the current event concludes. An exception to this is during inclement weather. For safety, we don't want anyone changing the sign in bad conditions. If an event runs into the evening, please have at least two people out there changing the sign together. One argument I heard was that "our committee" sponsors the event, so no one person is in charge of the event. Whoever chairs that committee IS in charge, and there must be someone designated to change the sign.

We need to remain current at all times, and those persons/committees hosting events are the most logical choices to change signage information. For events during the business week, the office manager will update the signs as necessary. By keeping our signs up to date, the community knows what we are hosting, and every event receives maximum sign advertisement time.
