But just as there are many different eggs – the colored eggs in our baskets, ostrich eggs, chicken eggs, white eggs, brown eggs, quail eggs, goose eggs, and so many more – the eggs are also the same. To start, they are eggs! And each egg can bring forth new life, regardless of what laid it, regardless of what it looks like. The job of an egg is to bring forth new life. So, even if you are a pink egg with purple polka-dots, you are an egg with new life inside!

Yes, despite our differences, we are also the same in the important ways. We, as the Body of Christ, have the same beliefs. We all believe in the one God who loves us; in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, who died for our sins; in the Holy Spirit, our Comforter and Advocate; and in one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. These beliefs are the yolk of our egg, the very center of our being. Without the yolk, the egg will not produce new life. Our core – our yolk – are our beliefs, found in our Creeds. With these as our core, we can strive to lead new lives daily.

It is because of our differences and our sameness that we can be examples of how to love the unlovable, how to help the downtrodden, how to be the Body of Christ, in all our diversities.

Sisters and brothers, this Easter we leave the empty tomb. Know that death has been defeated and life has been made new. This Easter, let us celebrate the diversity of our eggs, the diversity of this world as we live new lives, lives worthy of the Body of Christ.

We are the people of the Resurrection! May the Resurrection, Joy, and Power live in us all!


